#### Overview by Chairman - Cllr Howell Davies

Over the past 12 months we have organised and held many events which will be discussed later in our Annual Report. We review these activities on a regular basis and are always looking for ways to improve and extend them. If any residents have any ideas we are more than happy to listen and see what we can do to include them in future events. I am particularly keen to get our older residents involved and I am looking for ideas and activities that would be of interest and hopefully get them away from "Coronation Street" for an hour or so.

The Parish Council would also love to hear from any residents that might be able to spare some time, however small, to help out with setting up on our fun days or perhaps taking part in one of



the litter picks in an effort to keep the Parish looking good. Keeping the Parish, especially the flower beds, in tip top condition is ongoing as the seasons change and takes quite a lot of work. The bulk of the work is carried out by Councillor Geoff Cork, our Caretaker Brian Laidler and a small band of volunteers. Their efforts have gained the Parish the highly sort after Northumbria in Bloom 'Silver Gilt' award, which we are all very proud of.

This year we will trialling a new competition with our neighbouring communities through the Chester le Street AAP called "Chester's Best". Cllr Geoff Cork has been very instrumental in leading this activity and has gained support all over the town If anyone would like to help out at all please get in touch.

You might have also noticed that quite a lot of work has been carried out on the Millennium Green over the last few years with tree pruning and general tidying up. With the addition of the goal post and the fun ball hoop the area is being used on a regular basis and we hope is a safe environment for children to play in and enjoy the facilities. #### <sup>3</sup> Working Group — Community events

Our Working Group have been working hard on community engagement and planned some wonderful events & schemes for our residents.

We have launched a Kindness Campaign in order to motivate our residents to 'Be Kind in Waldridge'. The campaign was initiated with random acts of kindness in our community. We have distributed books, flowers, seedlings and peg dolls throughout our parish for our residents to find and will continue to develop this further. We've also arranged some events that stem from the Kindness Campaign including the 'Big Waldridge Spring Clean' and our 'Post a Smile' letter-writing morning. We've shown kindness to our animal friends too, by hanging bird fat around the Millennium Green, and we hope to expand on this in the coming months.



Residents are also invited to nominate their neighbours and fellow-parishioners for a 'Box of Kindness' each month, which acknowledges and encourages the lovely community spirit that is ever-present in Waldridge.



To support the initiative we've created a hashtag (#bekindinwaldridge) so our residents can track what we are doing and share their own acts of kindness. Social media is something we are exploring as a useful tool to further engage our residents and our 'Be Kind In Waldridge' Facebook & Instagram pages have gained more than 100 followers each in a little over 3 months.

We've also expanded on our seasonal events, initially with the Easter Funday which was a fantastic and successful day. We plan to replicate this success over the Christmas period with another craft event for our younger residents, as well as a showing of a classic film in the parish rooms for our older parishioners.

Our biggest event of the year will be 'Pizza and Prosecco at The Pictures' in August, which consists of an open-air screening of The Greatest Showman on our Millennium Green and a pizza van and prosecco van serving food and drink. Tickets for the showing will be complementary and the food and drinks vans are offering our residents reduced rates for their products.

We're also exploring ways in which we can fundraise and contribute to an array of charities. The 'Grow Gold' idea initiated by Cllr Cork, in which he has coordinated golden flower displays in the parish to raise awareness of childhood cancer, has led to us raising £300 so far for North of England Children's Cancer Research Fund. We're also managing a sponsored 'toddle' for our littlest residents in order to raise money for Barnados in June and will be holding our annual 'Beating the Bounds Walk in June.

#### 5 Schedule of meetings

Notice of all meetings can be found on the Parish notice boards and the website one week prior to the meeting.

The Annual Parish Meeting is to be held at 6.00pm, usually before the ordinary meeting, but check the website for confirmation of this. Here the Parish Councillors, County Councillors, Neighbourhood Police and Wardens will be in attendance to take your questions. We also try to find guest speakers, if you would like to see a specific subject discussed, please do let us know and we will do our best to accommodate.
